PTP 2006: A Rousing Success!

Peel the Pumpkin 2006, which took place Oct 20-22 at the Berkeley-Carteret Hotel in Asbury Park was a tremendous success. As chair of the event, I'm happy to report (to those of you who missed a terrific time) that it went off without a hitch.

In the past, we held PTP at PS3 in NYC. In an effort to boost attendance from other clubs, an actual survey of Times Squares suggested moving the fly-in out of the city, as many found accommodations in NYC prohibitively expensive, which prevented out-of-towners from attending. Times Squares president John Nangle and his partner John Gillen worked tirelessly looking for something new and then discovering, researching and negotiating with the hotel. The result? PTP was moved out of NYC to an affordable, convenient and exciting venue.

Over 90 dancers pre-registered for the whole weekend and 120 attended with walk-in registration at some point during the weekend, with a great turnout for the Saturday evening festivities, which featured

a "hats" theme. The world-class callers (Tom Miller, Betsy Gotta and Andy Shore) were really "on", making the dancing even more fun than usual. The ballrooms were spacious and so beautiful that they didn't need decorations. The highlight of the event was the raffle, an extravaganza that created fever-pitch excitement all weekend. There were over 65 donated baskets, each one more beautiful than the next. At any given time, we found people hovering over their favorite basket, purchasing more tickets and hoping they'd be the lucky winner.

I'd like to thank: John and John for all their work, especially finding this terrific hotel where we hope to be again next year; David Kampel, the much-ignored Daniel Jason, Michael Coan and Mark Bennett for doing everything and anything that was needed; Bill Wolff for not taking a weekend off from his treasurer's duties; Nick Martellacci for his beautiful announcements on my behalf; Esther Sands for spearheading the raffle (you

November Board Meeting Minutes

Tuesday, November 14, 2006

Meeting called to order by Daniel Jason at 8:20PM. Daniel Jason presided at the request of John Nangle, who was unable to attend. The meeting was conducted according an agenda provided by John Nangle.

Board Members present: Bill Wolff, Chaya Levin, Daniel Jason, Frank Frederick and Michael Coan. Board Members absent: John Nangle and Vern Calhoun.

Also present: Andrew Meyer, Art Reimer, Joe Chodash John Gillen (joined the meeting at 9:10 PM), Richard Sands, and Rick Massi

1. Board Meeting Minutes: No official Board meeting was conducted in October due to the inability to attain a quorum on the scheduled date, therefore no October minutes were presented.

2. Financial Report. Bill Wolff presented the Financial Report. The Mainstream

and Plus classes are currently operating at a loss. The A and C2 classes are currently operating at a profit, however it is expected that the Advanced class may show a loss once outstanding rent bills for PS3 are received. The school is not current with billing the club for space rental. The A/C dances continue to show a loss. Peel the Pumpkin is showing a significant profit, even with some outstanding reimbursable expenses still expected for submission. The financial report was approved 5-0.

3. C1 "Boot Camp": Andrew Meyer presented a proposal for a weekend-long C1 boot camp to be held in New York City and open to out-of-town attendees. He presented a brief written summary of the recent similar event held by DC Lambda Squares with Dayle Hodge as instructor as well as a list of considerations regarding the proposed event, including proposed pricing from Dayle Hodge. Andrew indicated he was requesting the club's approval to proceed and sponsor the event, ideally to be held in January prior to DC Lambda Squares' AC/DC fly-in in February so that dancers could

A Vision Becomes a Success

There has been much discussion about moving Peel the Pumpkin out of New York City over the years. The pros and cons were discussed almost as much as fashion on Oscar night. The Board of Directors took a survey, and we learned that over 80% of our members who answered the survey wanted us to take Peel the Pumpkin on the road.

I cannot remember exactly when Christopher Daniels and Rob Buntzen first suggested moving Peel the Pumpkin to Asbury Park, but I will never forget that they did. I would like to thank them for doing so, as I am sure that everyone who attended our fly-in would as well. It was from that first conversation that the idea of holding Peel the Pumpkin in Asbury Park was born.

These two events gave John and I the incentive to take a trip last February to the Berkeley Carteret Hotel. We spent the first day touring the hotel, meeting with the hotel's sales staff, and gathering information on the possibility of holding Peel the Pumpkin at the Berkeley Carteret. Later that afternoon John and I went for walk on the boardwalk. It was cold, we were all bundled up, and had to wear sweaters under our winter coats. However, the sun was shining on our faces and the wind was at our backs.

It was during this walk that the vision of what a wonderful weekend our fly-in would be in Asbury Park, came to be. I, the wide eyed optimist, talked of how fabulous it would be. John, the realist, talked of all that needed to be done to make it happen.

At dinner that night, we discussed what we saw and the information we were given. We both came to the conclusion that hosting Peel the Pumpkin at the Berkeley Carteret would not only be fun, but that moving the fly-in would be best for our club. Knowing John as I do, I knew that because he believed the move to Asbury Park was best for Times Squares, he would do everything in his power to make it happen.

Back at the hotel, John and I put together a plan of action that would make this vision a reality. We both knew there were many obstacles to overcome: we could not afford the dramatic and lavish ballrooms of the Berkeley Carteret that would help make the event work. It is not PS 3, it is the Berkeley Carteret. It is not New York, it is Asbury Park. Peel the Pumpkin has always been in New York, and it will not be in New York. This was a short list. There were many more.

True to form, the next morning John started working to make the move to Asbury Park happen. He sold our vision to the hotel; this enabled him to negotiate the pricing so we could afford the dramatic and lavish ballrooms. John then obtained the approval of the Board of Directors to move our fly-in. He talked about the move and wrote about the move every chance he got. He remained positive and focused and I know I would not have let him be anything else.

Many people embraced and supported the move from the start, and many people who did not. Change can be difficult. There were several trials and tribulations along the way, but the plans kept moving forward. Time passed and suddenly it was October 20, and we were holding our fly-in at the Berkeley Carteret. Midway through the dancing on Friday night it was apparent to me that everyone was having a wonderful time. The weekend events went great and our fly-in was a huge success.

John and I stayed at the hotel until the last attendees had left. We walked through the ballrooms and recapped the weekend in our heads. We were later joined by Christopher

and Rob for a late afternoon walk on the boardwalk. I remembered the walk we took in February and the vision of what could be. I could not stop thinking of how lucky I was to be a part of what went on over the weekend.

I know I speak for both John and myself when I say we want to thank all who supported the move to Asbury Park. I know our Board of Directors and our chair person Chaya Levin will individually thank all of you who worked on the planning, organization and execution of this event. I would also like to say thank you to each and every one of you, for without you, the vision would not have turned into such a successful fly-in.

I would like to close by thanking John, our President, for his strong leadership abilities, his commitment to always do what he believes is right for the club, and for being such a positive driving force behind making the vision a success. I am grateful, as I believe everyone who was a part of Peel the Pumpkin should be, for his efforts.

Election Update and Directions

Six Times Squares members have chosen to run for the four seats on the Board of Directors that will become vacant in January. They are: Alan Willemsen, Andrew Meyer, Daryl Murphy, David Kampel, Joe Chodash, and Ken Ooi.

All Times Squares members should expect to receive information on the candidates and instructions on voting. That information should reach your mailbox in the next few days.

Several changes have been instituted in the voting process this year. The envelope you receive from the Election Committee will include a statement from each of the six candidates and a stamped and addressed postcard-size ballot. This postcard ballot will replace the legal size ballot that has been used in the last few elections. This change will save on postage, be more "green friendly" and will streamline the process of vote counting.

In another attempt to streamline the election process, the Board has approved a change in the deadline for voting. This year, all voting will take place before the end of the year. Your ballot may be handed to an Election Committee member up to and including December 31, 2006. After that date, no ballots will be accepted by hand. Your ballot may also be mailed. Please mail the postcard ballot in a timely manner to ensure that it is postmarked by December 31, 2006. Ballots postmarked in the year 2007 will not be counted.

In summary, all postcard ballots must be submitted in person or postmarked in the year 2006. Please consider returning your ballot as early as possible to avoid the "holiday rush" that the US Postal Service will experience by the middle of the month.

Rick presented and the Board addressed three issues of the election committee. Firstly, the Board approved that all candidates will be presented on the front side of a printed 11x17 sheet to be mailed to all members with voting instructions, and agreed to absorb the proposed printing cost. a postcard ballot will replace the previous paper ballots that required insertion into an envelope to return. Thirdly, in order to avoid the confusion of verifying membership renewals in January at the Annual Meeting, the voting for the 2007 Board of Directors will be closed on December 31, 2006 to assure that all voters are actually members when they vote. Rick reminded the Board that 30-days' notice of candidates must be provided to all members, and was granted approval to proceed with preparing election materials for mailing.

5. Peel the Pumpkin 2006 Review: Chaya Levin presented a report on Peel the Pumpkin. The event was a financial success, turning an estimated profit in excess of \$2,000. Chaya also pointed out that the basket auction alone grossed \$1,700. Anecdotal reports suggest that the event was positively received by attendees, especially dancers from other clubs. Chaya is submitting a recap and thank-you article to be published in the December issue of *Times Squared*. The feedback surveys from attendees are currently with John Nangle. Chaya offered to do a quantitative analysis of the results as soon as the surveys are delivered to her.

6. Finances for the A2 and C2 Classes: After discussion as to the purpose of this item on John's agenda, Daniel suggested that actual written projections on the A and C classes be provided to all of the Board members for review, in lieu of individual numbers circulating to only some parties.

7. Scholarships: This item was listed on the agenda provided by John Nangle, however Daniel indicated that he was not informed of what John wished to discuss. The item was tabled until the next meeting.

8. Mailing of Membership Forms for 2007. Bill Wolff confirmed that membership forms would be sent to all current members. Dave Torrey is currently updating the membership renewal form.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:50PM. The next Board meeting will be Tuesday, December 12 at PS3.
