Annual Meeting Minutes

Saturday, January 20, 2007

Meeting called to order by John Nangle at 7:15PM.

Board Members Present: Chaya Levin, Daniel Jason, Frank Frederick, John Nangle, Michael Coan (arrived late), and Vern Calhoun.

Board Members Absent: Bill Wolff.

1. Opening Remarks: Outgoing President John Nangle called the meeting to order, thanked those in attendance and turned the meeting over to Daniel Jason.

Board Meeting Minutes: Minutes taken by Daniel Jason, filling in for Vern Calhoun, for the November Board meeting were accepted and approved 6-0.

2. Financial Report. Daniel Jason presented the Financial Report for Bill Wolff, who was unable to attend. Bill had prepared a detailed statement for the meeting, which showed that the club is in excellent fiscal health with a bank balance at 2006 year-end of \$34,192.17,

an increase of \$11,763.33 from January 1, 2006. This healthy balance also includes all 2007 Peel the Pumpkin receipts received to date plus there have been no rental bills from PS 3 since summer. The three largest income sources were tuition, fly-in registration and membership fees; the three major expenditures were caller fees, space rentals and instructor fees. The 2006 Peel the Pumpkin in Asbury Park was our most successful ever, with a net profit of \$2,396.91. Calendar sales also added \$5,200.00 to the bottom line, a profit of \$320.00 by year's end. Combo dance income was up, largely because a few dances were cancelled by the board during 2006. Friday night A/C dances are still operating at a loss. All 2006 classes except Plus -- Mainstream, A, C1 and C2 classes are operating at a profit (which could become a loss if the rent from PS 3 is ever billed). Bill thanked the members who had made donations to the club in 2006 and assured a smooth transition to the new treasurer. The financial report was approved unanimously.

There is one other thing I would like to address in this article. Remember why you fell in love with square dancing. There are evenings where squares don't work and there are times when we get on each others nerves. But this is square dancing and bad squares and bad feelings do go away. The fun and the benefits of square dancing outweigh those moments of frustration. Come to square dancing to lighten your week and try not to sweat the small stuff.

I came out as a gay man in 1977, shortly before I turned 24. I grew up in New York City and consider myself fairly sophisticated. I came of age through the disco years, moved on to Broadway shows and Opera, traveled, changed careers and then set foot in PS 3 in 1992. I never thought I would still be square dancing fifteen years later. Square dancing has been a constant, providing me with friends and travel and a feeling of youthfulness.

I would like to acknowledge a few special thank yous. Being on the Board and knowing that you have Nick and Betsy on staff is a great asset. Nick and Betsy are excellent callers and teachers. We are very lucky to have them as a part of our club.

Michael Coan has been on the board for about forty years now and is a perennial asset to every board because he is the continuity of the board. We all come and go but Michael is the Crazy Glue that often holds things together.

Daniel Jason is one of the most talented men it has ever been my good fortune to know. Daniel can do just about everything and he does it all well.

I would like to thank Terrence Dineen, my former partner, for helping me get through my first term as President. Like John Gillen to John Nangle, Terry was everywhere I could not be, was at every event and served in about every capacity one could imagine.

I would also like to thank Eddie Careri. Eddie has been President of the Times Squares and a very good President. I would, however, like to remind everyone that Eddie is also the club yenta. Eddie knows when we are sick or when our loved ones are sick. Eddie knows a lot about us because he listens and he cares. Eddie is a good and compassionate man.

I could not end this article without paying my respects to those Times Squares Members who have passed on. Although we live in

the present, it is important to remember those who made an impact and those who have mattered. Richard Smith was my first square dancing friend and I sat at his memorial service and cried because four years of his friendship were just not enough. I also sat with my Times Squares friends at the memorial service of Paul Marino. We were touched and proud when the Times Squares, as one of Paul's loves, was acknowledged.

In May of 2005, we all paid our respects to Grant Willaman. Under the Gazebo in Rehoboth, we remembered how much we loved Grant and we promised to look out for each other and to remember how close we felt on that day. Every year at Convention, in the Memorial Room, I look at the badges of Richard and Paul and Grant and remember how much we have been through with one another and how we have laughed and cried. This year, help us share this wonderful square dance community. Let's get the word out that the Times Squares is an incredible place to be.

Thank you John, Daniel, Frank and Bill for your service and for keeping the club so vital. And contrary to popular belief, I *have* seen John Nangle smile. It was in August, 1983.

Vern Calhoun congratulated the club on breaking out of the doldrums by trying all kinds of new things, most notably Peel the Pumpkin in Asbury Park and the Calendar project (congrats to Daniel Jason and David Kampel). He encouraged members to pitch in and help the club by joining committees and volunteering time, as well as to present ideas that are outside the box, like the calendar project, to the Board in the future.

Outgoing Board member Frank Frederick expressed his gratitude for his time on the Board and stated that he would be a better member for his service, since he now had a full appreciation of how much time and energy it takes to do everything.

Michael Coan stated that this was a year full of big changes, a year where word of mouth brought in a very large Mainstream class as opposed to outreach events. There are many issues that the Board needs to consider going forward but he urged members to join committees and to consider that if they complain about something to the Board, they should be prepared to take charge of the issue.

Chaya Levin thanked the Mainstream class for coming to and supporting club events and thanked the Mainstream class angels for coming to help.

Daniel Jason read remarks from absentee outgoing Board member Bill Wolff, which said he hoped that there would be more suggestions and help from club members; that the membership would attend more dances (especially A/C); that people would help the club find new and less expensive space to dance in; and suggested that there be prepaid subscriptions to club dances to help defray costs. Finally, he hoped that there would be discussion on scholarship requirements and that the club would receive more feedback on outside callers.

Outgoing Board member Daniel Jason said that there were incredible people on the Board and that he was impressed by one and all and their dedication to making things happen. He singled out George Voorhis for his constant work on the emails, website and hotline, answering all calls and emails. He said that he felt numbers were declining

because we need to show people how great square dancing is and he had great hopes for the future because all of the candidates for the Board loved the club so much.

Michael Coan then thanked all of the callers, archangels, election committee, Trudy Lundgren, caller booker John Gillen, and David Kampel for general support.

4. State of the Club Speech by President

John Nangle: John expressed his pleasure at seeing five squares dancing Mainstream on Tuesdays. He's proud that we are the only club that teaches four different levels of classes in a given year. He hoped to see a better turn-out on Friday nights for A/C dances otherwise the new Board would have to consider the cancellation of some events.

He also applauded Daniel Jason and David Kampel for thinking outside the box with the very successful calendar project. It brought the membership together in the production of the calendar, brought name recognition to the club for doing something no other club has done and made money to boot. He would like to see more ideas for creative fundraising, etc. be presented to the Board.

Speaking of outside the box thinking, he expressed pride that Peel the Pumpkin in Asbury Park not only made money in its first year, but was the most successful fly-in in the club's history. He got some negative feedback about it, but by and large the support was overwhelming. The Berkeley Carteret sale has not gone through so we do not have a venue for Peel the Pumpkin 2007 yet. He suggested a drop-dead date of the March Board meeting. He hoped that there would be more people who would volunteer and help, and thanked Trudy Lundgren for continuing to edit and layout the newsletter every month in spite of being far from New York and on the road. That's dedication to the club.

Michael Coan injected some comments about the Pride Parade and Dance and the importance of getting more people involved. Because key people like himself (who usually rents the truck) were not available, the event was cancelled. It turned out well anyway, saving the club money and not affecting the Mainstream class, but felt the event should be reconsidered in 2007 assuming that there was more support from the club members.

John wrapped up by stating that the club was in very good shape, and that he hoped more people would chip in and help *your* club. He thanked the club for giving him four years on the Board and two as President and expressed his appreciation to the Board members he had served with, to David Kampel, the callers, and most especially to John Gillen, caller booker, Presidential column ghostwriter, and First Lady, "who did more than I did," according to John Nangle.

5. Announcement of Election Results:

Rick Massi, head of the Elections Committee, thanked the departing Board members for their service as well as all of the nominees for the Board who stepped forward for consideration. Rick then announced the new Board members were, in alphabetical order, Alan Willemsen, Daryl Murphy, David Kampel, and Joe Chodash.

6. Question & Answer: The secretary was not present for the Q&A.

7. Announcement of New Officers: The new Board met briefly and agreed that the new officers would be David Kampel, President; Joe Chodash, Treasurer; and Alan Willemsen, Secretary.

8. Next Board Meeting: There will be a brief organizational meeting for the new Board on Tuesday, January 23, 2007 at PS 3 at 7:00P. The first Board meeting will be held on Tuesday, February 13, 2007 at PS 3 at 7:30P. Members are welcome to come to the Board meetings.

John Nangle thanked the membership and the meeting was adjourned at 8:17P.
