## August Board Meeting Minutes

**Monday, July 30, 2007**

Meeting called to order by David Kampel at 7:36 pm.

**Board members present:** Vern Calhoun (arrived late), Joe Chodash (Treasurer), Michael Coan, David Kampel (President), Chaya Levin, Daryl Murphy, and Alan Willemsen (Secretary)

**Non-Board members present:** Fred Feliciano, Emad Heikel

**1. Secretary Report** – Alan announced that there was an error in the last meeting minutes. The representative from the Center whom Daryl was discussing Bingo Night with Times Squares (TS) was Ector not Trai La Trash. The meeting minutes of the last meeting along with the correction were accepted by a vote of 6 to 0.

**2. Financial Report** – The club continues to be in very good financial condition. The main sources of income for the month were tuition, reimbursement from Emad/Pride and PTP fly-in 2007. The main

expenses for the month were space rentals (all), instructor's fees and printing (two newsletters (July/August), more promotion postcards and Directory costs). A separate report showed that the expenses for the Pride March 2007 totaled \$2,493.00. The financial report was accepted by the Board by a vote of 6 to 0.

**3. Scheduling Committee** – Alan read the Scheduling Committee minutes from the July 18, 2007 kick-off meeting which lasted from 7:00 – 9:00 pm. Items discussed were roles and responsibilities and events for 2007 and 2008 including dances, workshops, outreach events and classes. Concerning the roles and responsibilities, the Scheduling Committee recommended the following for planning a TS-sponsored event:

1. A written proposal with contact person and information should be provided to the Outreach Committee.
2. After the Outreach Committee has evaluated and approved the proposal, it should become an agenda item for the Board to discuss.

3. After the Board has approved the event, the event can be discussed with the Scheduling Committee to ensure that the event can be scheduled.

The Scheduling Committee also wanted to state that:

- Any planned event cannot compete with any scheduled events.
- TS-sponsored events are covered by TS' liability insurance. Events not approved by the Board cannot be covered and cannot be considered to be sponsored by TS.
- Scheduling of callers should have a lead time of a minimum of four months as they are often booked months and, in some cases, years in advance.
- Early planning helps to reserve needed equipment for callers.
- Dance locations cannot be confirmed until, in some cases, weeks in advance depending upon the institution.

Alan also stated that as of July 1, 2007, there are 68 scheduled dance nights in 2007 and 102 planned dance nights in 2008.

The next Scheduling Committee meeting will be held on Tuesday, November 27, 2007 at 7:00 pm at PS3.

**4. Caller Booker Report** – Alan read the Caller Booker report submitted by Daniel Jason. The report covered callers involved with TS' combo dances, A/C dances, fly-ins and club nights.

- Combo Dances - Callers for all combo

dances for 2007 have been booked and contracted.

- A/C Dances - All 2007 A/C dances are booked and contracted except September 28, 2007. Several callers have been contacted and been unable to commit due to scheduling conflicts. Daniel will approach a few more callers for the event. As for 2008, approximately 50% are booked and confirmed.

- PTP Fly-Ins – All callers for PTP 2007 have returned executed contracts. Betsy Gotta and John Marshall are confirmed for PTP 2008. Callers for PTP 2009 are being investigated.

- Club Night – Approximately 40% of 2008 club nights have been booked. Offers are going out to four more callers by the end of August.

**5. Outreach Events** – Details of upcoming outreach events were discussed:

- Cattyshack Outreach Dance Night (August 16 and September 20) – Howard Richman will be calling. Contact Andrew Meyer for more information.

- Jersey City 7th Annual LGBT Pride Festival (August 25) – Daryl informed the Board that their will be a \$200 charge to participate. If there were any raffles or selling of items there would be an additional cost. After discussing the event, the Board decided that it would not be a proper venue as TS' strength lies in demoing (i.e., dancing

before possible new students). In addition, there are some additional limitations:

- o The dance space may be insufficient for a square.
- o A live caller would be an extra expense and using recorded music may not be possible if electricity is not provided.
- o If dancing is not possible, TS does have a tape showing previous dances but again the requirements are equipment and power. It was also expressed a video may not show TS in its best light.

It was also mentioned that a hard copy of the New York Times article should be laminated for various events for prospective students to read.

- Big Apple Ranch Outreach Dance Night (September 22) – Joe is pursuing Howard Richman to be the caller for the event. Contact Joe Chodash for more information.

- Bingo Night with Times Squares (Friday night, September?) – Daryl has yet to hear from the Center contact about a TS-themed event. He is also checking to see if there will be demo space available.

- Bear Events (Bear Café/Metrobears) – Alan mentioned that Bear Café may not be back in the Fall. Other bear venues are under investigation.

**6. Mass Mailing of Postcards** – A mass mailing to several clubs and organizations is being prepared by Andrew Meyer. He is expected to send out about 10 postcards to about 200 organizations and clubs.

C2 – The following individuals volunteered to be the Archangels for the 2007 – 2008 class calendar:

- Mainstream – Alan Willemsen
- Plus – Chaya Levin
- C2 – Daryl Murphy

All are currently investigating strong volunteers to assist. It was stressed that Mainstream Archangels might want to have a themed night to impress newcomers. Greeters should be present to welcome possible students. Archangels should also help prep Angels for the class season. In the past there have been issues with Angeling and Chaya mentioned an article on the conduct and duties of Angels and felt it would help reduce any issues. When squaring up, Angels should talk to individuals to see which position they would prefer and get them evenly balanced in squares. It was also suggested that any Angel who is not dancing should circulate and make a reluctant newcomer feel welcomed, and, if possible, urge them into a new square. Any additional Angels should consider squaring up rather than hanging in the back.

**8. Proposed New Summer Club Shirt** – Joe proposed and previewed an impressive club shirt based upon the club colors with TS' logo stitched onto it. It was suggest that Joe approach the manufacturer to see if he can get prototypes with the TS logo in small, medium and large sizes.

**9. Massage Therapy by Emad** – Emad showed a flyer to the Board advertising his services during the PTP 2007 fly-in. Joe will investigate whether it will conflict with services provided by the hotel.

**10. Peel The Pumpkin 2007** – Chaya and Joe, Co-Chairs of PTP 2007, were asked to give details and status of their shared responsibilities.

- Chaya's responsibilities entailed local promotion, basket arrangements, registration packets and gathering volunteers.
  - o Local Promotion – Chaya is working with Andrew Meyer to gather a list of local businesses to approach.
  - o Basket Arrangements – The display of where the baskets will be arranged was discussed. In addition, a flyer was displayed that was provided by Esther. It was urged that members should approach the Basket Committee for more information.

- o Registration Packets – Chaya is working on the packets which will include the activity schedule, local maps and other promotional material.

- o Volunteers – Chaya said she would be looking into defining duties and gathering volunteers.

- Joe's responsibilities entailed managing hotel arrangements, decorations, audio/visual equipment and a possible Saturday night party.

- o Hotel Arrangements – The hotel has a new staff and Joe has been discussing our requirements for PTP 2007. Arrangements include rooms and how they will be arranged at various times, providing tables for various needs (e.g., registration, baskets, flyers), and table skirts and risers when necessary.

- o Decorations – Joe discussed what can and cannot be done with regards to decorations and are proceeding with planning accordingly. He shared thoughts on making each room a different theme.

- o Audio/Visual Equipment – Can be made readily available but at a cost. TS will provide A/V equipment for the most part.

- o Possible Saturday Night Party – Joe approached the hotel about a possible country/western party after Saturday night's events which will possibly last until 2 AM. This event will be held in the hotel's local bar which has room for line dancing and two-stepping. This is under investigation as it may be a separate cost.

The activities schedule for PTP 2007 was extensively reviewed by the Board and some changes requested to better balance the callers, events and resources. A final schedule will be published at a later date.

**11. Next Board Meeting** – The next Board meeting will be held on Monday, September 10, 2007 at 7:30 pm at FIT. Check the web site for the next scheduled Board meeting in the event of changes. As always, members are welcome to come to the Board meetings. David thanked the membership and adjourned the meeting at 10:41 pm.
