Monday, August 4, 2008

**1. Secretary Report** – The meeting minutes of the last meeting were read and accepted by a vote of 6 to 0.

**2. Financial Report** – The club continues to be in very good financial condition. The main sources of income for the month were tuition, donations PTP 2008 and fly-in 2008. The main expenses for the month were space rentals (all), miscellaneous expenses and instructor fees. The financial report was accepted by the Board by a vote of 6 to 0.

**3. Times Squares Membership Directory** – Daryl confirmed that Dave Torrey will publish the membership directory. Dave will send a copy of the directory to Joe to print when it is ready for distribution.

**8. Outreach: Fire Island** – Emad announced that the August 16th event will be canceled as the venue was not suitable and would compete with other FI events. Alan reported that he met one individual from NYC who seemed genuinely interested in attending the open houses. He also reported that a representative from Rainbow Mountain was interested in Times Squares performing at their resort.

# My Life As A Caller – Part 2

Hello there. I just wanted to report back to you about some of the experiences I had at the gay caller school in Cleveland just prior to the annual IAGSDC convention.

WOW! What a great experience it was! The rigorous schedule consisted of three 12-hour days (9 a.m. to 9 p.m.) of classes and dances. Before going, I had thought this might be too much time. Afterwards, I realized it went by way too quickly. Most of the students and instructors stayed through their lunch and dinner breaks and even past 9 p.m. to work on their calling skills.

The instructors (Betsy, Ann, Sandra, Ett, Chris and Barry) were all so supportive. All of us students lent support as well, as we cheered each other on and offered assistance when needed. It was such a great opportunity and atmosphere to learn from, especially when one's confidence is a bit shaky.

Each day we had a different main caller (Betsy, Sandra, and Ann). They each had their personal touch and hints about calling. We were given numerous performance opportunities in front of a microphone.

There was homework every night and we had to prepare a singing call to perform at the school's closing dances.

I was in the beginners' group. (There were also intermediate and advanced groups.) At each session we learned new ideas on how to use choreography, building on each previous lesson. I was amazed at the improvements that each and every student made. Scott Treimel, another member of our club also attended the caller school. He did extremely well. With only two years' worth of dancing experience compared to my 12, he quickly impressed me with his abilities.

On Wednesday night there was a dance held, basically to allow all the students to perform either a singing call or a hash in front of all the other students. Other dancers straggled in and danced as well. I was selected to do a singing call, and I drew the very last time slot for the night.

At first, I was having a lot of fun dancing to the other callers. But as the night progressed, I developed an extreme case of nerves. I was pacing the floor outside the hall

for almost an hour before my performance. The dance was running overtime so my nerves were definitely getting a working over. I thought that most of the people would be leaving the dance early, as there was a live orchestra performance, followed by fireworks, occurring right in front of the hotel that same evening.

When my turn finally came, many of the dancers had remained. It was a weird experience going up on stage. I felt so far removed from the dancers. My only calling experience prior to this had been down on the floor, right in front of the dancers, and there had always been a caller/instructor next to me in case I needed some assistance. It was quite a shock to feel totally isolated in front of a group of dancers. I was on my own. There would be no assistance.

I delivered my singing call without a hitch—well, at least from the dancers' perspective. Towards the end of my singing call, I actually forgot whether I had done only 3, or all 4, of the singing call's sequences. Panic quickly set in as I struggled to recall. I had not written down the dancers' positions as most callers do, so I had no clue whether or not the dancers were back with their partners. What should I do? I chose to just finish off with the closing sequence. Luckily I had chosen well. I had averted a disaster. And I had finished just in time to allow the dancers to make it to the fireworks!

The next day there was another dance, this one open to all dancers. I was assigned to perform a hash call. I had wanted to do some sight calling, but my unsteady nerves were a little overwhelming and I had to revert to my written material. In spite of losing my place in my written choreography, I did fairly well.

The whole experience has had such a positive effect on me, even considering all the nervousness and the possible disasters that could – but never actually did – happen. It was extremely challenging and, as Scott and I can attest, we have a lot of hard work ahead of us. I plan to continue with my calling, and with all your and the club's continued support, I hope to develop into an accomplished caller one of these days.

If there are any other caller wannabes out there, I hope I have given you some insight on what to expect and let you know there are a lot of opportunities available to help you get started.

# You've Got Mail!

Here you are: reading another issue of the Times Squared newsletter. It's the September issue and you might be asking yourself: "Is the summer over already?" "Has another Labor Day come and gone?" "Is it too late to get tickets to the US Open?"

To all of your questions, the answer is "Yes."

As you know, Labor Day is one of those holidays, like April Fool's Day, May Day, the Fourth of July, and New Year's Day, that arrives at the beginning of the month, just like your regular issue for our club newsletter. This year, 83 Times Squares club members are receiving their newsletters online at the start of every month. When they submitted their membership forms at the beginning of the year, they checked off the "online" box as the means for their newsletter delivery. As a result, the club will save over \$400 in US Postal Stamps this year. But, alas, those online subscribers never get to see the colorful paper copies that are sent out to the other half of our members.

That other half of our members, 87 to be exact, is receiving colorful, paper copies of each issue of the newsletter at the beginning of the month. They smile when the June issue arrives on lavender colored paper,

the December issue on red paper, and the January issue on white paper. But, alas, on the calendar page of the paper copies, the colorful labels that Trudy includes are shown in plain black ink.

To create each issue, many volunteers work carefully to lay out, edit, proofread, upload/print and mail your copy. While great efforts are made to have the online and paper issues of the newsletter arrive simultaneously, occasionally there are problems.

For the last two months, a small problem has developed. Two club members (who are partners) have had a bundle of a dozen newsletters placed in their mailbox by their letter carrier. All of the newsletters have individual stamps and labels, and the bundle is nicely wrapped in several rubberbands, but only the top newsletter is addressed to those two members. (Oddly, the dozen newsletters in the bundle are for members in several boroughs and many zipcodes.) These bundles were returned to the letter carrier and were delivered to the right addressees, but probably a few days later than usual.

Normally, the newsletter is posted online and mailed through the US Postal Service without any problems or complaints from club members. Occasionally, someone will not receive his/her copy, or a copy will arrive with some pages missing.

Since this most recent snafu has happened on two consecutive months to the same couple, the three of us have been wondering

if this has happened to any other club member who receives a paper copy of the newsletter. Have you experienced a similar problem with the delivery of your newsletter over the last year or so? If your answer is yes, please let me know. Your response may help me to determine if the recent problem originates where the newsletters are being mailed (the Bronx) or where the bundle is being delivered (Brooklyn).

Enjoy the rest of the newsletter, whether you are reading it online or holding it in your hand.
