July Board Meeting Minutes

Tuesday, July 15, 2008

Meeting called to order by Daryl Murphy at 7:43 pm.

Board Members Present: Joe Chodash (Treasurer), Michael Coan, Emad Heikal, David Kampel, Andrew J. Meyer, Daryl Murphy (President) and Alan Willemsen (Secretary)

1. Secretary Report – The meeting minutes of the last meeting were read and accepted by a vote of 7 to 0.

2. Financial Report – The club continues to be in very good financial condition. The main sources of income for the month were tuition, fly-in 2008 and donations. The main expenses for the month were miscellaneous expenses which included badges, class supplies and association fees/subscriptions, and space rentals (all). The financial report was accepted by the Board by a vote of 7 to 0.

4. Pride March – Emad reported that spirits were high during Gay Pride and that

were not dampened when the rain poured down on the parade. He thanked everyone who kept marching and is looking forward to next year. He reported the costs of the parade and the Board discussed several items to consider for next year's parade. Item discussed were:

- Instituting a Parade Coordinator for managing and monitoring all aspects of the Pride March
- Parade Marshal to watch dancers and control progress throughout the parade
- Consideration for Callers who may have a conflict of interest
- Insurance coverage for the parade and other performance venues
- Performance rehearsals to project a fun and professional image
- Equipment and trailer considerations to reduce costs and ensure participation during extreme weather conditions.

5. Times Squares Directory – Joe talked about his discussions with Dave Torrey who is preparing the Times Squares directory. Dave provided several options on how to
